A Place at the Table: Social justice in an ageing society

We celebrate Social Justice Sunday on 25 September. This year, the Australian Bishops' Social Justice Statement is titled: 'A Place at the Table: Social justice in an ageing society'.

The Statement celebrates the value and dignity of older people in Australian life. It challenges us to recognise their significant contribution to society and emphasises that this contribution should not be valued in mere economic terms. The Statement calls for justice for those who are most vulnerable and warns about a view of older people as burdensome or dispensable.

"Flight" by Nadia Wheatley, winner of this year's Children Book Award.

The current Social Justice Statement about Refugees and Asylum Seekers called, 'For those who have come across the seas' is coming to a close however, the matter needs our sustained commitment towards a just outcome for the 1313 people who are still held in off-shore detention. "Flight" was awarded the Children's Book Council of Australia Picture Book of the Year. I like to think this prize is a vote of support for the millions of refugees who, like the characters in this story, are sacrificing everything they have in the hope of finding a safe home. You are encouraged to listen to Nadia Wheatley's acceptance speech (1:30min long). You might also consider reading this book as part of Advent, given the focus aligns with the flight into Egypt by Mary, Joseph and Jesus. 

Saint of the Week

Bl. Teresa of Calcutta: Feastday Sept. 5th, Patron of World Youth Day.

The remarkable woman who would be known as Mother Theresa began life named Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu. Born on August 26, 1910 in Skopje, she was the youngest child born to Nikola and Drane Bojaxhiu, Receiving her First Communion at the age of five, she was confirmed in November 1916. Her father died while she was only eight years old leaving her family in financial straits. Gonxha's religious formation was assisted by the vibrant Jesuit parish of the Sacred Heart in which she was very involved as a youth. Subsequently moved to pursue missionary work, Gonxha left her home in September 1928 at the age of 18 to join the Institute of the Blessed Virgin Mary, known as the Sisters of Loreto, in Ireland.
