<u>Saint of the Week</u> St. Notburga <u>Feastday:</u> September 14 <u>Patron</u> servants and peasants Birth: 1265 Death: 1313 Patroness of poor peasants and servants in the Tyrol. Born in Rattenberg, in the Tyrol, she was the daughter of peasants. At eighteen she became a servant in the household of Count Henry of Rattenberg When <u>Notburga</u> repeatedly gave food to the poor, she was dismissed by Count Henry's wife, Ottilia, and took up a position as a servant to a humble farmer. Meanwhile, Henry suffering a run of misfortune and setbacks, wasted no <u>time</u> restoring <u>Notburga</u> to her post after his wife died. <u>Notburga</u> remained his housekeeper for the rest of her life, and was famous for her miracles and concern for the poor.


