The Ascension of the Lord / Year B 12th & 13th May 2018

The feast of the Ascension invites us to face the universal experience of the loss of a loved one, and to face it in a transformative way. In Ordinary Time, we celebrate the life and ministry of Jesus. Over the period of Lent and Easter, we have been re-membering his death and resurrection. The liturgy now draws us into another aspect of the Mystery, that of the presence and absence of the One who has been raised. The physical loss of Jesus means a new and different sort of presence. Like the early Christians, we need time to grasp each dimension of the one great Mystery of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.


Today's gospel passage receives little attention in commentaries and classes because, along with the immediately preceding passage (Mark 16:9-14), it is a late addition to the original text of Mark's gospel. The author of these verses is familiar with the similar commission to proclaim the good news to all nations and to baptise in the name of the Trinity, found at the end of Matthew's gospel. In Mark 16:15, the command is to go "into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation (ktisis)." It is a more inclusive vision than Matthew's and opens a space for an ecological reading of the text, an extension from the human to the other-than and more-thanhuman elements of the Earth community. The command to proclaim the good news, the gospel, recalls the first words of the Markan Jesus, "The time is fulfilled, and the kin-dom of God has come near; repent [=expand your horizons], and believe in the good news" (1:15).

If we were to accept that our mission in the "in-between times" is to bring the gospel to all creation, then we might take more seriously God's command in Genesis 2 to reverence and protect the earth (usually translated as "to till and to keep"). We might stop polluting the air that all creatures need for life. We might also read the affirmations of Genesis 1 through the lens of Mark 16 and respect once more the intrinsic goodness of all creation as a gospel imperative.

The "Ascension" event recounted towards the end of the passage presupposes a pre-scientific, three-tiered understanding of the structure of the cosmos. In this ancient view, God is in the heavens above and Jesus is caught up into God's realm. The vertical movement is balanced by a horizontal movement: Jesus' return to "the right hand of God" ensures a

different kind presence in the church despite his seeming absence, one that enables the believer to continue the healing and re-creative ministry of Jesus "to all creation".

CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME: (Continued from last week)

How often do we stop to think about where the paper we use comes from?

There are some simple things you can do to reduce your paper usage and minimize your personal impact.

Nine ways you can reduce the impact of your paper consumption:

- 1. Use 100% recycled toilet paper. Even better, purchase your toilet paper from a company like 'Who Gives a Crap' whose business model is based on Corporate Social Responsibility.
- 2. Use 100% recycled paper for printing, instead of paper made from virgin forests.
- 3. Reuse gift bags and wrapping paper or wrap gifts in nice tea towels or cloth.
- 4. Find a substitute for paper towel use. A great reuse of old towels, sheets or clothes is to cut them into squares, fold them and have them under the sink ready to go. They can then be thrown in to the washing machine to reuse again!
- 5. Use real dinnerware for picnics and parties, not paper (or plastic) plates and bowls.
- 6. Use a reusable coffee cup for takeaway.
- 7. When printing, use both sides of the paper.
- 8. Say 'No' to junk mail put a sign on your letter box for 'addressed mail only'.
- Use a handkerchief instead of tissues.
