# **TO SLOW THE SPREAD OF COVID-19**

- Until further notice from the bishop, holy water fonts have been emptied or removed.
- Avoid touching your face. At Mass, this affects the sign of the cross, and our ritual action before the Gospel.
- Avoid contact at the sign of peace.
- If you handle money during the collection, apply hand sanitizer afterwards.
- At communion, flatten your palms to eliminate hand-to-hand contact.
- Until further notice from the bishop, the Precious Blood will not be distributed.
- When you wash your hands, use soap and warm water and create a lather for 20 or 30 seconds: the length of one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary."

# TO FOSTER THE SPREAD OF PEACE

- A public rosary will be recited half an hour before every Mass, imploring our Lady's prayers for our families.

- Identify the people in your social circle who are most vulnerable to fear and isolation, and reach out to them.
- The church will be open throughout the day for private visits to the Blessed Sacrament. Obtaining the Lord's peace, "a peace the world cannot give," is a service we can render our neighbours.

SEVENTH SUNDAY OF ST JOSEPH

His sorrow when he lost the Child Jesus; his joy in finding him in the temple.

#### INTRODUCTORY PRAYER

O glorious St Joseph, pattern of all holiness, when you lost the child Jesus, you sought him sorrowing for three days, until with great joy you found him again in the temple, sitting in the midst of the doctors. By this sorrow and joy, we ask you, with our hearts upon our lips, to keep us from ever having the misfortune of losing Jesus through mortal sin. Grant that we may seek him with unceasing sorrow, when we commit a serious sin, until we find him again, ready to show us his great mercy in the sacrament of Reconciliation.

#### GOSPEL READING (Lk 2:41-50)

His parents went to Jerusalem every year at the feast of the Passover. When Jesus was 12 years old, they went up according to custom; and when the feast was ended, the boy stayed behind in Jerusalem. His parents did not know it and made a day's journey before they searched for him. When they did not find him, they anxiously returned to Jerusalem. After three days they found him in the Temple, sitting among the teachers, listening and asking questions; all who heard him were amazed at his under-standing and his answers. When they saw him they were astonished; his mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us so? Your father and I have been anxious."

He said, "How is it that you sought me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" They did not understand the saying which he spoke to them.
