WE ARE A CHILD SAFE PARISH.

Dear Friends,

In the context of the parable in the gospel, the younger son who says 'Yes' when asked to go and work in the vineyard is the one who behaves properly to his father. But he changes his mind and refuses to go and work in his father's vineyard. The elder son who says, 'I will not' disobey and humiliate my father. Later he realizes his responsibility and the obedience to his father, goes to the vineyard and works. Here we notice that: what Jesus asks about in the parable is not which of the sons behaved honourably and respectfully to his father but which of the two did his father's will? In the kingdom of God, this is what really counts: we have to do the will of God.

Jesus then points to the tax collectors and the sinners who initially say 'No' but eventually repent from their sins and wrong doings, hence wish to do God's will finally. Jesus points out here that the people who rejected John the Baptist's invitation to work for the kingdom of God, have accepted his invitation to work for his kingdom. Let us be clear about this invitation to work for God's kingdom. No matter what we say or do in our lives we have to remember that, at the end of our earthly journey God's kingdom is the only place of destination. So let us regret for ignoring the invitation of Jesus and to begin working for his kingdom in the future. -Neville

First Reading: Ezekiel 18:25-28

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

The sinner who decides to turn against sinfulness deserves to live.

The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows: 'You object, "What the Lord does is unjust." Listen, you House of Israel: is what I do unjust? Is it not what you do that is unjust? When the upright man renounces his integrity to commit sin and dies because of this, he dies because of the evil that he himself has committed. When the sinner renounces sin to become law-abiding and honest, he deserves to live. He has chosen to renounce all his previous sins; he shall certainly live; he shall not die.'

Second Reading: Philippians 2:1-11

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Philippians

(If our life in Christ means anything to you, if love can persuade at all, or the Spirit that we have in common, or any tenderness and sympathy, then be united in your convictions and united in your love, with a common purpose and a common mind. That is the one thing which would make me completely happy. There must be no competition among you, no conceit; but everybody is to be self-effacing. Always consider the other person to be better than yourself so that nobody thinks of his own interests first but everybody thinks of other people's interests instead. In your minds you must be the same as Christ Jesus). (Shorter version)

His state was divine, yet he did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as men are; and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross.

But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

He went out moved by regret. The tax collectors and prostitutes will precede you into the kingdom of God.

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'What is your opinion? A man had two sons. He went and said to the first, "My boy, you go and work in the vineyard today." He answered, "I will not go," but afterwards thought better of it and went. The man then went and said the same thing to the second who answered, "Certainly, sir," but did not go. Which of the two did the father's will?' 'The first' they said. Jesus said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, tax collectors and prostitutes are making their way into the kingdom of God before you. For John came to you, a pattern of true righteousness, but you did not believe him, and yet the tax collectors and prostitutes did. Even after seeing that, you refused to think better of it and believe in him.'
