WE ARE A CHILD SAFE PARISH.

Dear Friends.

This weekend we celebrate Palm Sunday in which we commemorate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. A large crowd welcomes Jesus into Jerusalem, spreading their cloaks on the road and cutting branches from trees and putting them in his path. Here, Jesus is received the way worldly kings and emperors are welcomed by their local people. The crowd is overwhelmed with joy because they see Jesus as their Messiah who comes to save them from their oppressors, especially the Romans. They shout "Hosannah", meaning 'save us now'.

But Jesus does not enter the city of David like a conqueror or warrior. Instead, he rides on a donkey fulfilling the prophecy of the prophet Zechariah of a meek king entering Jerusalem. In ancient times, kings like David and Solomon had their royals ride on powerful horses or on chariots after the pattern of the Greeks and the Romans cultures. Still, the humble ride does not hide the kingly dignity of Jesus, for as the rest of the prophecy reveals, this king shall proclaim peace to the nations. His dominion shall be from sea to sea. Peace cannot be conquered by the sword. It is a gift of God. We received this through the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. As we go through the 'Holy Week' in coming days let us closely take part in Jesus' passion, death and resurrection and obtain his gift of peace in our lives. - Neville

Commemoration of the Lord's Entrance into Jerusalem

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew. 21: 1-11

- When they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, ² saying to them, 'Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find an ass tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me.
- ³ If anyone says anything to you, you shall say,

"The Lord has need of them,"

and he will send them immediately'.

⁴ This took place to fulfil

what was spoken by the prophet, saying,

⁵ 'Tell the daughter of Zion,

Behold, your king is coming to you, humble and mounted on an ass, and on a colt, the foal of an ass'.

Holy Land Collection - Good Friday, April 7, 2023

The annual collection for the support of the church in the Holy Land will take place on Good Friday, April 7. The ongoing effects of the pandemic have created enormous challenges for the people of the Holy Land in terms of health and a catastrophic loss of income due to the absence of pilgrims. Pilgrims are vital because they generate income that allows the Friars and local Church to fulfil their mission of caring for the Holy Places (that also gives work to the local people), as well as running parishes, schools and caring for orphans, refugees, the homeless and more. It is also used to maintain over 70 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus. The Pontifical Good Friday Collection will continue to support the works of the Holy Land through the generosity of the Australian Church. Your donation is a direct way to make a difference in the lives of people who are keeping alive the Christian presence in the land of Jesus, often in the face of great odds and in recent years, made all the more difficult by the pandemic.
