CELEBRATING 50 SPIRIT-FILLED YEARSPUBLISHED: 05 JUNE 2017



Pope Francis at Charismatic Renewal vigil in Rome

Huge numbers of singing, clapping pilgrims in bright red baseball caps, descended on Rome over Pentecost to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Catholic Charismatic Renewal (CCR), Austen Ivereigh reports in Crux.

The big event was the Pentecost vigil in the Circus Maximus, when Pope Francis prayed with some 30,000 pilgrims from 230 countries, offering them guidance and invoking a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Hundreds of Pentecostal and evangelical leaders who form part of CCR communities also took part. Meanwhile, it's been a time for looking

back and taking stock of the significance of a movement that began - like the Church itself - from a small group of people swept up by an intense experience of the Holy Spirit: Not, this time, in Jerusalem, but on a campus near Pittsburgh in 1967.

From that so-called "Duquesne weekend" the Renewal spread rapidly, as people were baptised in the Spirit, and new groups and movements appeared across the Church, touching millions. Charismatics speak of the greatest spiritual awakening since the early Church, an "outpouring of grace" for all Catholics.

During a symposium at the Vatican's Urbaniana university last Thursday, some of the CCR's leading minds were taking stock of the road travelled so far and thinking about what it has meant for the Church.

To describe this as a symposium doesn't quite capture it. There was "praise" - including singing in tongues - beforehand, and quite a few of the speakers couldn't resist kerygmatic outbursts that elicited from the audience outbursts of "Alleluia" and "Praise the Lord!"

The main takeaway for me was that in the Francis pontificate the two currents of renewal in the modern Church - the "conciliar" and the "charismatic" - are meeting in an exciting new moment that many described as a kairos, or "time of special graces".



SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

When he was crucified Jesus uttered: 'It is finished.' What had finished? His earthly ministry during which he painted a picture of the most intimate communion between Himself, the Father, and the Holy Spirit, so intimate that the Church needed a new word: 'Tri-Unity' or 'Trinity' for short.


God is pulsating, shimmering light, dancing in threefold exchange of love, each being simultaneously poured into the other. God is 'Being-In -Love' and love is always relational.

'You are made in the image and likeness of God'? Because of the ministry of Jesus Christ, we know what that really means. We are made to live in relationship – not in solitary.

If we think that the ultimate good is to be self-sufficient/autonomous, that leads to a hellish existence. When we live with as much self-giving as is possible, we are on the way to a heavenly existence.

We could pause for a moment to give thanks for the revelation of the nature of God, and consequently of the true nature of human beings.
