# Australian Catholic Church Plenary Council 2020 – Listen, Dialogue, Discern

To promote our own prayerful thinking about our responses to the question – what is the Holy Spirit asking of the Church in Australia? We look forward to the many varied voices of Cathedral parishioners being heard. Your 200 words are invited. This week Kevin Murphy of Ballarat writes

*I think the Holy Spirit might be asking he Church in Australia that we learn from the* experience of the Church communities that St Paul founded in the Mediterranean area during the years after his conversion. For example, he went to Philippi, a Roman colony, and established a church community during his short time there. Presumably, that church community celebrated baptisms when necessary and even what we now call the Eucharist. While St Paul does not ever mention the need for priests, it seems that he gave a new meaning to the meals that the new Christians had together. In a mysterious way, Jesus was present at the meals of the new believers, though there is never any mention of priests for the new communities. But the new communities did learn the stories about Jesus, about his remarkable life and death and resurrection, and the remarkable stories told by Jesus in his teaching. They would have been moved by his Story and stories. The meals the new Christians had together seemed to be very important. Perhaps for them the "Mystery" gatherings were special occasions to enter into the Mystery of Jesus and be strengthened to live and work for the Kingdom of God.

#### **Gospel Reflection by Sr Veronica Lawson RSM**

After a lengthy detour over the past six weeks into the gospel of John with its focus on Jesus as the Bread of Life and the Bread of Wisdom, we return to Mark's gospel and a legal dispute about ritual purity. The parties to the dispute are Jesus, the Pharisees, and some of the scribes or teachers of the law. [It is worth noting that Mark's non-Jewish readers, at a later time and in another place, need to be given detailed information about certain Jewish traditions].

At issue for the scribes and Pharisees in the story is the failure of Jesus' disciples to respect their oral tradition, in this instance to perform ritual washings before eating. From their perspective, the disciples are not "walking" according to the tradition of the elders. For the Markan Jesus, "the command of God" is paramount, not some distorted interpretation of it. He offers a hard-hitting counter-critique of their attitude to law. He calls them "hypocrites" and informs them that the condemnation of the prophet Isaiah was intended for them. They have so distorted God's law, substituting their own observances for the "commandment of God" that their prayer amounts to nothing more than lip-service, their hearts are far from God, and their worship is worthless! For Jesus, there are criteria other than such observances for determining who is clean or unclean. He has already declared the leper clean (Mk 1:41-45). For Jesus, the "heart" is the locus of purity and impurity.
