



Developing a Culture of Safety

The Linton Parish continues to work towards developing a culture of safety for all, especially Children and Vulnerable adults. Guided by the policy of the Ballarat Diocese for *Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults* and the *Code of Conduct for Working with Children*, parishioners who work with children and vulnerable adults are required to have a current Working With Children Check and to have completed the Online training module about protecting children and vulnerable adults. To assist us we are seeking expressions of interest from parishioners who would interested in being the Parish Safeguarding Officer to provide support to other parishioners and ensure that all safeguarding procedures outlined in the Code of Conduct for Caring for Children and the new Child Safe Standards are complied with.

A challenge from Laudato Si: On care for our common home. (Pope Francis, 2015): "Once we start to think about the kind of world we are leaving to future generations, we look at things differently: we realise that the world is a gift which we have freely received and must share with others" (LS 159). As a simple point of justice we should be meeting our current needs, not taking more than necessary, whilst acknowledging the capacity of future generations to meet their requirements for a full life. Action: Check your consumption, eg. food, electricity, water, gas. Use energy efficient appliances. Endeavour to move to renewable sources of energy when and where possible.

Divine Renovation?

Fr James Mallon (Archdiocese of Halifax-Yarmouth, Nova Scotia, Canada), the author of the book Divine Renovation: From a Maintenance to a MIssional Parish. His recent presentation in Melbourne will be shared with parishioners on Thursday December 1st from 7.00 pm in the smaller hall. This focus on evangelisation is an important one for our Parishes as we continually seek ways of being welcoming, hospitable and evangelising faith communities.

Adult prisons are no place for young people

Catholic Social Services Victoria calls for an urgent, comprehensive response to the problems faced in youth justice, including a systematic expansion of prevention and diversion, urgent attention to remand and a comprehensive focus on the development of each person. This is in the interests of these young Victorians and is needed to build the safe community that we all desire.

1st Sunday of Advent Gospel Reflection (Sr Veronica Lawson RSM)

"Where is the Life we have lost in living?" asks the Chorus in T. S. Eliot's The Rock. The Jesus of Matthew's gospel is implicitly asking much the same question as Eliot's Chorus. He is making much the same observation as Henry David Thoreau, "Most [people] lead lives of quiet desperation and go to the grave with the song still in them." We are invited to find Life in our living and to sing the songs that are in us. We are to be agents of our own future rather than unthinking participants in the inevitable round of daily activities that have preoccupied humans from time immemorial.

As we begin a new liturgical year, Matthew's Jesus invites us to contemplate the ultimate realities even as we attend to the demands of the present. He tells us to be "awake", to be "ready" all the time, not because death or the end of the world are around the corner, but because we need to recognise the multiple "advents" or arrivals of the Christ, the Human One, who calls us beyond self-absorption to Life. He reminds us that we are no different from our forebears who from earliest days have gone about their daily business without being sufficiently attentive to what really matters.

In our times, we have allowed thieves to break in and plunder our planet, our common home, because thieves come in guises that we fail to recognise. They so often look just like us and do the things we do. It may be that we must first be attentive to our own ways of plundering the house that is home to all of God's creatures.

We spend much of our time looking back. That has its place, since our history informs our present and helps us in shaping our future, though all the while we know with Auden that '[t]he past is foreign country: they do things differently there'. Advent invites us to look forward rather than back and to dream gospel-inspired dreams that will enable creative change in our own lives and in the life of our planet. It invites us to be awake, to be ready for any eventuality.

Dreams and visions have always been the precursors to effective and life-giving change. We need the grace to see visions and to dream dreams that make for justice and peace and that permit us to walk more freely in the light of God's ways. We seek the grace to "see" God's word as did the prophet Isaiah in the first reading (Isa 2:1-5). We need to put our energy into creating lifegenerating systems that enable us to move forward in the paths of gospel compassion and love.
