- 66 Prayer is an essential part of the Lenten experience.
- There is a saying that without prayer, fasting is just 67
- dieting. Without prayer, almsgiving is just social work. 68
- 69 Prayer connects us with our loving God.
- 70 So during Lent, it is important to focus more time on
- 71 prayer. This is a good time to develop a daily prayer
- 72 habit if you don't already have one. If you already have
- 73 a prayer habit, consider adding to it. Or change it up
- 74 if your routine has become stale and dry. 75

76 Fast from a Bad Attitude or Habit

Fasting helps us focus on God as the greatest importance 77 in our lives. Other things we can do without. It unites us with our Lord Jesus who fasted in the desert for 40 days. 80 Sometimes we are called to give up a food item, 81 like lollies or soft drink.

- 82 Sometimes we are called to give up something which is
- occupying our time, like video games or social media. 83
- 84 This is a good time to think about what is ruling your life.
- 85 Where is your attention drawn?
- 86 What is occupying your time and thoughts?
- 87 Give that thing up.

And then when Lent is over, contemplate where your focus went when you no longer had that thing. Were you more able to focus on God and others?

If so, try not to let the thing you gave up take over your life again. If you go back to it, keep it under control, in check.

TRUSTING THE PROMISE

At the beginning of Lent, it is not uncommon for people to feel discouraged or dissatisfied. Another year has come and gone and there is still much to be done as we get our spiritual house in order. Today's readings converge as they give reasons not to lose heart in God or, perhaps more importantly, in ourselves because we are loved by God. Abraham and Sarah were prepared to set out on the greatest adventure of their lives in their old age. Such willingness to trust in God's promises, despite the difficulties that lie before us, is at the very heart of the life of faith.

Prior to setting out for his final journey to Jerusalem, Jesus instructed the disciples that a brutal death awaited him. They were discouraged and bewildered, fearful both for Jesus and themselves. In the midst of this Jesus takes some of them aside and goes up the mountain and is transfigured before them. Their fear is now replaced by terror, but Jesus comes and touches them, encouraging and empowering them for the road that lies ahead.

In a similar fashion, the second letter to Timothy invites him not to be disheartened by the challenges and difficulties that beset him. God's grace and power have already been poured freely into our hearts. Since this is the case there is no need to be disheartened or fearful. Jesus' death has already won the victory, all that is needed is for us to take heart and trust in the new life that has been promised to us.


