This past week in the Cathedral Parish we have celebrated many events, which like those highlighted last weekend, emphasise great service and generosity that is part of our being the Cathedral Parish in the midst of the City of Ballarat. The concert on Wednesday evening with David Hobson and Georgia Wilkinson brought more than 500 people into our precinct for this wonderful Christmas event. Making a Scene at Christmas (MASAC), the display of over 300 Nativity scenes that Is happening in the Cathedral hall this weekend reminds us of the centrality of Christ at Christmas and the diversity of cultural expressions of the incarnation.

Our own community has celebrated another end of school year Mass with St Thomas More Alfredton celebrating the end of year Mass in the Cathedral on Tuesday evening. This year there have been over 440 students enrolled at St Thomas More with over 50 graduating Year 6 students. After the 10.30 am Mass last weekend (December 12<sup>th</sup>) morning tea was offered in the smaller Cathedral hall with many offering to ensure that this monthly event will continue on the first Sunday of the month in 2017. This highlights both the importance of hospitality in building a community of faith and the need to build teams of parishioners who are willing to work together to offer such hospitality. The Mass at Kallara Special Accommodation in Cuthberts Rd Alfredton on Wednesday morning was an extraordinary celebration of faith with the residents who gather each Sunday with our Cathedral ministers of holy communion. Our thanks to Bev Caligari, Francis Elliott, Max Smith, Trudie Dickinson and Yvonne Beaston who have committed to this ministry on our behalf at Kallara. Other parishioners ensure that those in their homes who are no longer able to attend Mass at the Cathedral are able to share in Holy Communion each Sunday. We thank Lorraine Stuart, Di Hanlon Julie Flett and Sharon Moss who are part of this ministry. Each Sunday after 8.00 am Mass Dorothy Ludwell ministers Holy Communion to the Catholic residents at Gandarra, while Heather Miles goes to the Peter Heinz Centre, Talbot Place. Fr James will celebrate Mass there this week. The celebration of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Rite of Reconciliation on Thursday evening which developed the theme of peace as we prepare the celebration of the Prince of Peace is also an important sacramental preparation for Christmas. The final gathering for Soulfood was held on Friday evening at which our young adults gathered as they have regularly through the year for prayer, reflection and faith sharing.

The wedding of Alicia McGrath and Brad Shilton on Saturday afternoon will be the final wedding celebrated in the Cathedral for 2016. We ask God's blessing on them as they begin their married life together. All of these events, gatherings, meetings and ministries highlight the importance of people in the Cathedral Parish who are seeking to do what Pope Francis says that a parish is called to do. In his Apostolic Exhortation The *Joy of the Gospel* he says "The parish is the presence of the Church in a given territory, an environment for hearing God's word, for growth in the Christian life, for dialogue, proclamation, charitable outreach, worship and celebration. In all its activities the parish encourages and trains its members to be evangelizers. It is a community of communities, a sanctuary where the thirsty come to drink in the midst of their journey, and a centre of constant missionary outreach."
