REFLECTION ON TODAY'S SCRIPTURE:

When we read of the meal at Emmaus, we cannot fail to see the parallels with the actions of the Last Supper, in which Jesus instituted the Eucharist. The fourfold actions of taking the bread, blessing it, breaking it and giving it are present, and it is in these actions that the disciples recognise Jesus.

Look at the structure of the Liturgy of the Eucharist and see where each of these actions is present: the preparation of gifts, the Eucharistic prayer, the fraction rite and the giving of communion.

SYMBOLS AND IMAGES:

The journey of the disciples to Emmaus recalls our own journey from doubt to faith. Informed by the Scriptures and nourished by the Eucharist, the disciples know that Jesus walks with them.

PRAYER FOR TODAY:

Lord Jesus, make your word plain to us; make our hearts burn with love when you speak.

SPECIAL PRAYER FOR ANZAC DAY:

God of love and liberty, we bring our thanks this day for the peace and security we enjoy, which was won for us through the courage and devotion of those who gave their lives in time of war. We pray that their labour and sacrifice may not be in vain, but that their spirit may live on in us and in generations to come. That the liberty, truth and justice which they sought to preserve may be seen and known in all the nations upon the earth. This we pray in the name of the one who gave his life for the sake of the world, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
