Integrity in the Service of the Church - PREAMBLE

What is this Document about?

This Document outlines principles of conduct for any lay person who performs paid or unpaid work in the service of the Church (Church Worker). Church Workers, along with clergy and religious, contribute to the mission of the Church. This document deals with the behavioural standards expected of them in their work.

The principles and standards in this document, with due distinction, parallel those for religious and clergy found in Integrity in Ministry.

Who is the Document for?

- organisations or bodies within the Church to which Church Workers belong.
- those who employ, engage, assign, supervise, train or are responsible for Church Workers.

Child Protection Week 'Be Someone Who Listens to Children'

Francis Sullivan CEO of the Catholic Church Truth Justice and Healing Council said the 2015 campaign highlights the importance of primary prevention to reduce child abuse and neglect in Australia. "This year's theme, 'Be Someone Who Listens to Children', sends an important message that the safety and wellbeing of Australian children should be at the very forefront of our approaches to protecting children and that listening to children is central.

The Royal Commission has recently released a major research report looking at how children understand and experience safety in institutions. In the report, Taking Us Seriously: Children and young people talk about safety and institutional responses to their safety concerns, children and young people have identified what institutions should do to help them feel safe and be safe. "Hearing directly from children is key to understanding how best to prevent and respond to child abuse in its many different forms", Mr Sullivan said.

"Unless we are able to provide environments where the primary focus is on children, their participation is valued, they are safe and their carers are appropriately selected and trusted, then children will continue to be at risk," Mr Sullivan said.

National Child Protection Week is coordinated by NAPCAN (National Association for Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect) and runs from 6-12 September 2015. NAPCAN was co-founded in 1987 by Rosemary Sinclair AO and Christine Stewart OAM and has made a major contribution to the safety and wellbeing of Australia's children and young people. Over more than two decades it has raised public awareness of child abuse and neglect and its impacts, and developed and promoted effective prevention strategies and programs.
