A Parish Mission for Linton and Beaufort Parishes

Jesuit priest Fr Richard Leonard will lead a Mission for the parishioners of the parishes of Linton and Beaufort in October $14^{th} - 18^{th}$ 2017. Fr Richard will celebrate the weekend Masses and then offer the following three days for the mission with two sessions each day – one in the Linton Parish and one in Beaufort. The Ballarat Diocesan Foundation has provided a grant to enable this Mission to take place. Arrangements are yet to be finalised with details of each day of the mission to be arranged in conjunction with the Beaufort Parish.

From the Royal Commission

The week has seen the first of the three week hearing of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse to inquire into the current policies and procedures of Catholic Church authorities in Australia in relation to child-protection and child-safety standards, including responding to allegations of child sexual abuse. On Monday the Commission published data relating to the extent of claims of child sexual abuse in the Catholic Church of Australia including the proportion of priests and non-ordained religious (1950 – 2010) subject to a claim of sexual abuse. A total of 1,880 alleged perpetrators (diocesan and religious priests, religious brothers, religious sisters, lay employees or volunteers) were identified in claims of child sexual abuse. Of the 1,880 alleged perpetrators identified: 693 were non-ordained religious (37% of all known alleged perpetrators), being 597 religious brothers (32% of all known alleged perpetrators) and 96 religious sisters (5% of all known alleged perpetrators), 572 were priests (30% of all known alleged perpetrators), being 384 diocesan priests and 188 religious priests, 543 were lay people (29% of all known alleged perpetrators) For 72 known alleged perpetrators (4%) the religious status was not known.

The overall proportion of priests from Australian Dioceses who were alleged perpetrators is 7.9%. In the Diocese of Ballarat where there have been 200 priests from 1050 – 2010 there are 8.7% who are alleged perpetrators.
