

Celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the Year of Mercy

On Thursday December 17th at 7.00 pm, Bishop Paul will lead the Cathedral Parish in our Advent celebration of the Rite of Penance with the 2nd Rite of Reconciliation.



Opening of the Door of Mercy for the Jubilee Year of Mercy

This jubilee calls on Catholics to reflect on the theme of mercy. Holy doors will be opened at Cathedrals around the world starting Sunday. At the opening of the Holy Door of Mercy in Rome this week, Pope Francis said: "You cannot conceive of a true Christian who is not merciful, just as you cannot conceive of God without his Mercy. Mercy is the key word of the Gospel. ... We should not be afraid: We should allow ourselves to be embraced by the mercy of God.

Bishop Paul will open the Door of Mercy in our Cathedral at the 10.30 am

Mass. With a sense of gratitude for the gift of the council and for all the gifts the church has received from God, Pope Francis invites us to enter into the Jubilee of Mercy. "With these sentiments of gratitude for everything the Church has received, and with a sense of responsibility for the task that lies ahead, we shall cross the threshold of the Holy Door fully confident that the strength of the Risen Lord, who constantly supports us on our pilgrim way, will sustain us. May the Holy Spirit, who guides the steps of believers in cooperating with the work of salvation wrought by Christ, lead the way and support the People of God so that they may contemplate the face of mercy." (para 4) Welcome to all who are joining us today for the opening of the Door of Mercy, all are invited to the Hall after the 10.30 am Mass to share in a cuppa.

VATICAN CITY — Pope Francis is calling for more emphasis on tenderness, including in the Catholic Church, in a world he said was marked by cruelty and atrocities. He took his Church to task in an interview published Wednesday in Credere, a Catholic magazine reporting on the Holy Year of Mercy, called for by Francis and starting Dec. 8. Francis lamented that the Church itself "falls into the temptation to take a hard line, the temptation to stress only the moral laws." He wondered "how many people are left outside" the Church by that emphasis. The pope said the world needs a "revolution of tenderness" because, "from here, justice and all the rest derives." He added: "We are used to bad news, cruel news and to even bigger atrocities, which offend the name and life of God."
