Signs of Love

1 Corinthians 12:4-11; John 2:1-11

Usually in Year C, the Gospels are taken from Luke, but today, in keeping with a theme of 'beginning' we hear the first miracle story from the Gospel of John. It is a story you are probably familiar with; how Jesus was able to provide an enormous amount of very good wine for the wedding group at Cana. But this is just the surface story. The way John's Gospel works is to use these dramatic miracles as 'signs' pointing to something far deeper. We are told at the end of this scene, 'This was the first of the signs' so it is important when reading John to know that the meaning of the miracle will be hidden below the surface sign.

The Gospel was written to be understood by its audience/readers, and the writer frequently communicates the deeper meaning of his narratives using key symbols that would be familiar to the audience or readers of his time. Since this Gospel was written for an audience living towards the end of the first century familiar with the traditions and Scriptures of Israel, today's readers will need help to understand these symbols. Frequently the Gospel depends on the reader knowing an Old Testament text, either explicitly quoted, or just alluded to. Often the reader is expected to know Jewish customs or the rituals and symbols associated with Jewish festivals. Without this knowledge, the modern reader can miss the major point of a Johannine episode.

At first glance, the miracle at Cana appears to be a simple miracle story – Jesus provides abundant wine at a wedding. But a closer reading reveals far more. The steward of the feast called the bridegroom to congratulate him on the provision of such abundant good wine towards the end of the feast (2:9-10). This indicates that, at a Jewish wedding ceremony, the bridegroom had the task of providing the wine. But, in this case, it was Jesus who provided the wine and so the evangelist is giving a clue, or a sign, that *Jesus is the bridegroom* at this feast. Within the Old Testament, the image of a bridegroom and bride was frequently used to speak of the loving relationship between God and Israel, as in today's first reading (see also Hos 2:19-24; Jer 2:2) and a feast was a symbol of the covenant (Exod 24:9-11; Isa 25:6-9). In presenting Jesus as the bridegroom, John identifies Jesus as the covenanting God of Israel, now enfleshed. Recent Deaths: Peter Conlon, Jack Costa, Basil McKay
