Bishop Paul led us in a beautiful celebration of the opening of the school's administration area. Concluding Mass, everyone followed the children singing, in true Pied Piper style, to the school's multipurpose facility for the unveiling of the plaque. While Bishop Paul and Fr Paul blessed the new building, Principal Frank McGrath spoke of the one hundred and twenty one years of Catholic Education in Charlton and the wonderful legacy left by the Sisters of Our Lady of the Missions and Sisters of Mercy. In the last forty years, lay people have tried to maintain the wonderful example set by those orders of hard working religious who had gone before us. Mr McGrath thanked Fr Paul, the School Advisory Board, Brad Carr from the Catholic Education Office Ballarat. Brent McKnight Drafting Services, Searle Bros Builders, the Supplementary Capital Fund, the Ballarat Diocesan Finance Council and the school who provided savings. BOLT'S WINNING SMILE: How many Golds now? Do we credit our success where Usain does his?



Usain St. Leo Bolt:

"I want to thank GOD for everything he has done for me cause without him none of this would be possible."

Usain St. Leo Bolt was born and raised in Sherwood Content, Trelawny, Jamaica.

Bolt is a Catholic and his middle name was given to him in honor of one of the Catholic Church's earliest Popes. Bolt is devout in his faith. He makes the sign of the cross before beginning a competition and, according to his public relations people, he is a "Bible-believing, Godhonoring, Jesus-worshiping Christian."

It's not something he talks much about. Though he does occasionally tweet things like:

With God anything is possible... I demolish training today #thankuGod His faith and his celebrity inspired the Vatican to invite him to speak at a conference on global religious liberty through the popular TED (technology, entertainment and design) program.

In addition to his other inspirational outward signs of faith, more encouraging than Bolt's hard-earned gold medals is that he wears an even more powerful medal: the Miraculous Medal, as promulgated by French Saint Catherine Labouré (1806-1876).

The Miraculous Medal features an inscription invoking the prayerful intercession of the Lord's Mother with these French words: "O, Marie, conçue sans péché, priez pour nous qui avons recours à vous" ("O, Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee").
