Cardinal Pell has lodged an appeal. I do not intend to make any further comment on the case while the appeal process is ongoing.

We will continue to offer help to anyone who has suffered abuse. We will also continue our commitment to keeping children safe today.

Central to the mission of St Patrick's Cathedral Parish Ballarat is an unequivocal commitment to fostering the dignity, self-esteem and integrity of children and young people and providing them with a safe, supportive and enriching environment to develop spiritually, physically, intellectually, emotionally and socially.

All staff, volunteers, contractors, clergy and parish council members of the Cathedral Parish are expected to actively contribute to a parish culture that respects the dignity of its members and affirms the Gospel values of love, care for others, compassion and justice. They are required to observe child-safe principles and expectations for appropriate behaviour towards and in the company of children.
