



CHAPEL AND REFLECTION GARDEN

At the commencement of the 2015 school year, a new chapel was established at Trinity College Colac, which opens on to the Reflection Garden. The first chapel was built as part of the original Christian Brothers' residence and even after the Brothers moved out to private premises, the chapel was used by the school. However, due to lack of space because of the increase in student numbers, the chapel was decommissioned in 2010. A temporary chapel was set up in a portable building in 2014. Finally, in 2015, as part of the College Master Plan, a new chapel was established in what had previously been the music room since 1997.


On November 14, 2014, Bishop Paul Bird opened and blessed the Reflection Garden. The Garden was built by Trinity College with assistance from the Parents & Friends Association. The Chapel opens onto the garden and is an area of serenity and peace.

A marble stone commemorating the lives of deceased staff and students from our Trinity College community has been incorporated into the Reflection Garden. A specially designed leaf engraved with the deceased person's name and dates of involvement with the College, will be attached to the wall. The first two leaves have been placed in memory of Mrs Betty Marwood. Betty worked for both St Joseph's College and Trinity College Colac for a total of 31 years.

Families of former students or staff of Trinity College or St Joseph's College, can apply to have their deceased loved ones name printed on a 'leaf' and included in the garden. The details are all available from our website
