Year one students from St Malachy's School, Edenhope experienced a range of activities that were interesting and filled with learning. They walked down to the nature reserve where Gloria Freeman, a long time resident of Edenhope, ran a series of activities including bush cooking, scavenger hunting and nature spotting. These activities related to learning in science and literacy where students have been looking at lifecycles and habitats.

The children were also lucky enough to see quite a few red-tailed cockatoos as well as some kangaroos, lizards and wallabies.
