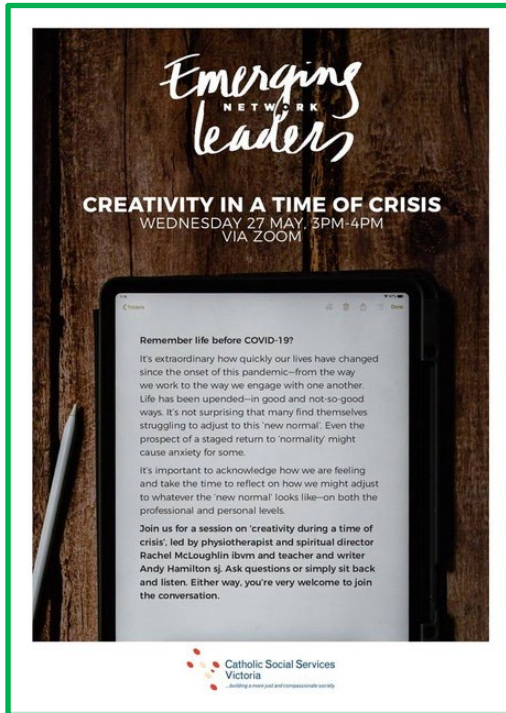




CREATIVITY IN A TIME OF CRISIS
