



## National Apology to Victims and Survivors of Institutional Child Sexual Abuse

### A Message to the People of the Diocese of Ballarat

Prime Minister Scott Morrison will deliver a *National Apology to Victims and Survivors of Institutional Child Sexual Abuse*, this coming Monday, 22 October 2018. The *National Apology*, to be delivered at Parliament House in Canberra, will acknowledge the appalling abuse perpetrated on vulnerable children by the very people who were supposed to care for them, including members of our Church.

At a recent conference in the Diocese of Wollongong on *Creating a Safe Church from Within*, Mr John Crowley, St Patrick's College Ballarat Headmaster, gave a heartfelt reflection. He addressed the importance of us, as the Church, openly and honestly acknowledging the hurt that has been caused. John said, "This acknowledgement must, above all else, avoid the use of the word, 'but'. Why? Because a genuine acknowledgement opens and prepares our hearts to truly hear the voices of those victims and survivors deeply wounded by our Church. Most profoundly, without it there can be no trust. Without trust, how can hope exist?"

It is true that words can be hopelessly inadequate if not accompanied by effective action. Our faith assures us that if our actions are grounded in an openness to God's grace, they can produce the fruit that we and the whole of society so desperately want to see.

So, as we join together as a nation to say sorry, I invite you, as followers of Christ, to pray this prayer of healing and hope.
