We need to remember that we go to Mass not only to get something but also to give something, namely our worship, praise and **thanks** to God. Of course, we do receive much in the Eucharistic celebration. In bread, broken and blessed, and in the cup of the new covenant, **we receive forgiveness and the life of Christ**. We become the body of Christ, more closely bound to him and to one another. The Lord loosens the bonds that enslave us to unchristian behaviours multiplying in turn our reasons to give **thanks**.
