"Faced with the tragedy of tens of thousands of asylum seekers, fleeing death as victims of war and hunger...the Gospel calls on us and asks us to be the neighbours of the smallest and the most abandoned, to give them concrete hope." Pope Francis said in a recent address.

Social Justice Statement

The title of the 2015-2016 Statement is **For those Who've Come Across the Seas: Justice for refugees and asylum seekers.** It is taken from second verse of Australia's National Anthem and reminds us all of our nation has aspired to be a place of welcome and inclusion.

In this Social Justice Statement, Australian's Bishops ask us to re-examine our responses to refugee and asylum seekers. The Statement reminds us of nearly 60 million people around the world who are displaced from their homes and of the war and violence that are devastating countries in the Middle East, Africa and Asia. When people come to us seeking refuge, can we in conscience respond to them with cruel and self-defeating policies such as offshore processing and indefinite detention?

This Social Justice Statement is inspired by the example of Pope Francis on his 2013 visit to the Mediterranean island of Lampedusa, where he met the survivors of a refugee tragedy and mourned and prayed for those who had died .

Inspired by the example of Pope Francis, Australia's Bishops ask how we can show leadership both here and overseas in forging a humane response to the challenge of refugees.
