XIV Ordinary Synod of Bishops (4-25 Oct 2015)

Theme: The Vocation and Mission of the Family in the Church and the Contemporary World

So what is a Synod of Bishops? It's a coming together (usually every 3 years) of the Pope with Bishops from around the world to discuss important issues facing the Church.

So why all the attention on this Synod? It has attracted far more attention than any other Synod in living memory, probably because...

1. The topic, that is the family, is where we live our most intimate relationships
2. There are massive sociological changes that families face
3. There is wide interest in Pope Francis.

The Pope sees sharing 'the joy of the Gospel' as both affirming the goodness of faith-filled families and welcoming in a non-judgemental manner those who live outside these families. This is a huge challenge that families face daily. It may require a shift in Church attitudes at many levels. A two-year process In fact the Pope considers this so important that he has convened two synods on the topic, each with worldwide consultations. The first, held last year, will be used as the starting point for the coming XIV Ordinary Synod in October. So this is really a two-year listening process and we are called to pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit through this careful process. Let's pray specially for our two attending Australian Bishops, Archbishop Mark Coleridge of Brisbane and Bishop Eugene Hurley of Darwin. Finally, the Pope is expected to publish his conclusions. *"The family which experiences the joy of faith communicates it naturally. That family is the salt of the earth and the light of the world; it is the leaven of society"* Pope Francis.

Integrity in the Service of the Church

The Principles and Behaviours Associated with the Service of Church Workers

People observing this principle will:

1.3 Church Workers recognise injustice, unfairness and abuse when it occurs in the workplace and respond appropriately

1.3.1 Be alert to workplace inadequacies/injustices and responding promptly, sensitively and decisively.

1.3.2 Implement appropriate grievance procedures against improper and unreasonable administrative acts and any other expressions of injustice in the workplace.

1.3.3 Alert proper authorities to signs and acts of injustice, unfairness and abuse.

1.3.4 Inform complainants of appropriate resources and procedures for redress.

1.3.5 Remain impartial when allegations of injustice, unfairness and abuse arise.

1.3.6 Provide support impartially for both accused and complainant when grievances arise.

1.3.7 Familiarise staff and volunteers with the Church's protocols and procedures for addressing complaints for the specific workplace and as contained in Towards Healing and Integrity in Ministry.
