**Couple Saints**

The parents of St Thérèse of Lisieux, Blessed Louise and Zélie Martin, were canonized by Pope Francis on Sunday Oct 18. It is said that the Martins had 'two hearts in one, welded together by conjugal love.' As the Bishop of Seez put it, their lives were given to God, to each other, to their children, to the Church and the society of their day.

The reliquary of another 'Couples Blessed', Luigi and Maria Beltrame Quattrocchi, were in the Synod chapel during the proceedings. They "lived an ordinary life in an extraordinary way. Among the joys and concerns of a normal family life, they had an extraordinarily rich spiritual life." - Pope John Paul II
