November 2015 is a historical month to take action against climate change. On November 30, 2015 world leaders will inaugurate the Paris Climate Summit (called COP21) and sign a treaty to tackle the climate crisis. And throughout November, we will pray and mobilize as never before, to put into practice the Pope's *Laudato Si* message. To get started, the Bishops of the world released this "Appeal to the COP21 Negotiating Parties" and our movement responded with this "Call for a Month of Climate Action". Integrity in the Service of the Church

Church Workers who are policy and decision makers work to create conditions where those who are poor, alienated or marginalised are treated with understanding and compassion.

4.5.1 Establish and support programmes that reach out to those who are poor, alienated or marginalised.

4.5.2 Assist all Church Workers for whom they are responsible to act always with sensitivity and compassion.

4.5.3 Provide a climate of warmth, welcome and connection when those who feel alienated or marginalised from the Church take tentative steps to return.

Church Workers strive for excellence in the performance of their work

Church Work calls for the application of skills appropriate to different types of service in the Church.
