Pope's Prayer Intentions for April

Universal: Small Farmers That small farmers may receive a just reward for their precious labour.

Evangelization: African Christians That Christians in Africa may give witness to love and faith in Jesus Christ amid political-religious conflicts.

Faith opens a "window" to the presence of the working of *the Spirit*. It shows us that, like happiness, holiness is always tied to *the little gestures*. "Whoever gives you a cup of water in my name will not go unrewarded", says Jesus (cf. Mk 9:41). These *little gestures* are those we learn at home, in the family; they get lost amid all the other things we do, yet they make each day different. They are the *quiet things* done by **mothers** and **grandmothers**, by **fathers** and **grandfathers**, by **children**. They are *little signs* of tenderness, affection and compassion. Like the warm supper we look forward to at night, the early lunch awaiting someone who gets up early to go to work. *Homely gestures*. Like a blessing before we go to bed, or a hug after we return from a hard day's work. Love is shown by *little things*, by attention to small daily *signs which make us feel at home*. *Faith* grows when it is lived and shaped by love. That is why our **families**, our **homes**, are true domestic churches. **They are the right place for faith to become life, and life to become faith.**

Jesus tells us not to hold back these *little miracles*. Instead, he wants us to encourage them, to *spread them*. He asks us to go through life, our everyday life, encouraging all these *little signs of love as signs of his own living and active presence* in our world.


God creates a promise of life **beyond death** and summons us to a future beyond human **imagination**, to be co-workers of a **new life with him**.

Confirmation is the second sacrament of initiation. The Bishop (or his deputy) confirms a person’s Baptism through anointing with oil of Chrism. Through the laying on of hands over the head of the confirnee, the Bishop (or his deputy) invokes a further outpouring of the Holy Spirit that enhances a candidate’s **giftedness** and encourages them to put their **gifts** at the service of the Community.

Session 1—Belonging

There are many groups to which we belong, one of the most important being our family. Belonging to the Church means that we are part of God’s family, and we become part of God’s family through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

AIMS:

- To help children identify a feeling of belonging to the faith community by reflecting on their experience of belonging to a family, team, school, etc.

- To help the children to realize that as members of God’s family we are called to be fully involved in the life of the faith community.

On Friday 8th April 2016, Pope Francis published a new papal document called, *Amoris Laetitia*, ‘The Joy of Love: On Love in the Family’ at the Vatican in Rome. It is about marriage and family life.
