Living the Gospel

Restoring to life

We may not have the capacity to enact a miraculous 'resurrection' as Jesus did with the widow's son, but we certainly have the capacity and frequent opportunity to restore someone to life in the manner that Jesus restored the life of the widow. Whenever we encounter someone who has been cast out by life circumstances or by the cruel actions of others, we have the capacity to restore them to a fuller life through our actions. We restore life when we restore dignity; when we refuse to participate in grinding someone down and instead extend a hand to help them up.

CAN AND SPREAD DRIVE- Koroit

OUTSIDE SCHOOL HOUR CARE AND MINI VINNIES are holding a CAN and SPREAD DRIVE from the 1st June to the 20th June. Our aim is to get 10 cans/spreads donated each day for 20 days a total of 200 cans/spreads.

These items will then be given to FOODSHARE to distribute to needy families.

We are asking for your help to get 200 cans of food or spreads like jam, vegemite, honey, fruit salad, baked beans, corn, tuna or stews. If every child/family is able to bring in two cans or spreads during this time and place it in the box in their classroom we feel that 200 items is achievable.

Reflection

It may be daring to say that Jesus did not bring the man back to life out of concern for the man. What do we read? 'When the Lord saw *her*, he felt compassion towards *her*' – not *him*! Who is this 'her' Jesus really focused on, the one he particularly saw in that little procession of mourners?

The 'her' was a widow in a patriarchal society. The dead son is not a youngster but a man. He is the breadwinner and protector for his mother. Without an able man in her household, she will be reduced to poverty and be very vulnerable.

We may say that Jesus restored the life of this man in order to restore the life of the mother. The Gospel emphasises this by telling us the purpose of this saving ministry of Jesus: 'He gave him to his mother.' She would now have enough to eat, and be able to live out her years in a secure



"After Jesus raised her son from the dead, the widow of Nain glorified God."
Luke 7:1 – 17

Can you see those who are vulnerable? Can you perceive how society is organised in such a way as to deny some people the necessities of life: food, shelter, health care, education, companionship? Does the seeing and perceiving send a shudder of compassion through your body, as it did for Jesus?

We could pause for a moment to ask for the grace to see how we might respond in life-giving ways to those who need to know that 'God has visited his people'.
