FIRST EUCHARIST—WEEK ONE

Baptised Christians gather to celebrate their faith. Just as families celebrate at special times, Catholics also gather to celebrate belonging to God's family. This gathering and celebrating is most fully expressed when we gather at Mass.

AIMS:

- To help the children appreciate their uniqueness and identity as members of their families.
- To enable the children to identify significant events in the life of their families and how these occasions are celebrated.
- To remind the children that through their Baptism and Confirmation they are members of God's family.
- To enable the children to link their own experience of gathering and celebrating to the gathering and celebrating of God's family, which is most fully expressed in the Eucharistic celebration.
