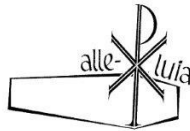


Making Connections: Be alert and watchful for the needs of others this week and be ready to respond to those needs. Rejoice in the unexpected.

For 16 days commencing last Friday, Australian Catholic Religious **Against Trafficking in Humans** urge us to join the global campaign to combat gender-based violence.
