#### We welcome the season of Lent

Lenten season is moment of grace for all of us to make a pilgrimage into our interior life, where we encounter the Lord and open our hearts to His transforming love. In the forty days of journey, the Church provides us the necessary weapons in order for us to overcome temptations: ie fasting - how we will die to our selfish desires, prayer - how we will strengthen our communion with God, and almsgiving - how we will express our greater love for our neighbour Jesus comes to our rescue to set us free from the powers of the devil. He faced the devil directly and battled with him. He disarmed him of his weapons using the Word of God. Quoting the Scripeter Jesus shows us that the truth revealed in the Word of God is more powerful than the snares of the devil. We cannot defeat the devil with our strength, but with the power of God. Following Jesus we can be victorious over all our temptations with faith that we belong to Christ and He is at our side to defend our cause. We don't live by the bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God. Let us give ourselves, a time to reflect and meditate on the Word of God and convert to the Lord with great sincerity so that will give the grace and courage to change our interior life to bear eternal life. #### Statement from the justice and healing Council

The most significant and far reaching change is the establishment in November last year and independent body to set standards within the Church for Child Safety. The company, Catholic professionals Standards Limited, will audit and report on the compliance by bishops and religious leaders with the standards. It is a not for profit company, with its own governance structure, and with a board made up of lay professional's. Professional standards will apply across all aspects of the Catholic Church activities and will cover not only our children, but anyone who comes into contact with the Church. The Company will audit the performance of Bishops and religious leaders on how their services comply with the standards. The audit reports will be made public. In this way the leaders will be held accountable. This is a dramatic change to the accountability of bishops and congregational leaders. The significance of this change will have ramifications for years to come.

We continue to pray for the victim's and survivor's of sexual abuse and their families. We remember them especially during these weeks as the Royal Commission reaches its conclusion. We cannot change the past, but it is our solemn duty to do all in our power to identify and eradicate systemic factors that have either led to abuse or accommodated it in the past.

Although the revelations are disturbing and upsetting for all of us, the set of statistics below revealed data for the Royal Commission can give us some hope that we are in fact much more vigilant in our efforts to effect change. The figures below show what portion of the total number of priests who ministered in the Ballarat Diocese within a particular decade were alleged perpetrators subject to an allegation of abuse falling within that decade.

**Ballarat—1950's 3.2%, 1960's 6.65%, 1970's 3.8%, 1980's 2.5%, 1990's 2.0%, 2000's 0.00%**

The media can tend to support and foster a public perception that sexual abuse continues to occur even now on the same level. It has in the past. These statistics refute that claim and support the fact the Diocese of Ballarat over the past 20 years has worked hard to change a culture that has assisted the development of a harmful and unsafe environment within our Church.

#### Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence from meat.

On all other Fridays, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled through any one of the following:

- (1) **Prayer:** For example, Mass attendance: Family Prayer: A visit to a church or chapel, reading the Bible, making the Stations of the Cross, Praying the Rosary.
- (2) **Self Denial,** for example, not eating meat, not eating sweets, reducing time for watching TV or other entertainments'.
- (3) **Helping others,** for example, taking the family to visit the elderly in an old people's home or in the Parish, visiting the sick or someone who is lonely.

(All who have completed their eighteenth year and have not yet begun their sixtieth year are bound to fast. (Canon 1252). All who have completed their fourteenth year are bound to abstain.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday March 1, 2017.

On Good Friday and, if possible on Holy Saturday until the Easter vigil, the Paschal Fast is observed.

Each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This is to be done between Ash Wednesday (March 1) and Trinity Sunday, (June 11), unless for a good reason it is done at another time during the year.
