

St. Fina or Seraphina, 1253 The old town of San Geminiano in Tuscany treasures with special veneration the memory of Santa Fina, a young girl whose claim to be recognized as a saint lay in the perfect resignation with which she accepted bodily suffering. She was born of parents who had seen better days but had fallen into poverty. The child was pretty and attractive. Poor as she was she always kept half her food to give to those who were worse off than herself.

From Fr. Andrew Hayes:

No, the other Shepherds

I've had a couple of gueries (complaints?) about our "Year of Eradication of the Shepherd." Thanks for the robust discussion. Both people understood that we're talking about shepherds as a symbol of all people who are judged by society to be "less worthy" but the idea of shepherds being eradicated still rankled a couple of our actual keepers of sheep. So, to clarify, we're eradicating 1st century Palestine shepherds, the bible time shepherds, as a symbol of all who get dudded by a culture that doesn't value them (migrants, Muslims, asylum seekers, gay people, many women, all who apparently are less worthy.) So, if you're a descendant of the 1st century shepherds then come back and tell me you're still offended. If you're a modern day "top of the heap" shepherd, then we're not talking about you. Mind you, that our sheep keepers are offended at the very suggestion of being undervalued, ("how dare you slight us, even by using us as a symbol of the downtrodden? Use somebody else. Use the tax collectors.") does point to how uncomfortable it must be to actually be on the less worthy list.

Holy Thursday Passover Meal

Our schedule for Holy Thursday evening is as follows: Lake Bolac 5.30pm Mass of the Lord's Supper. Ararat 7.30pm Traditional Jewish Seder Meal followed by Mass of the Lord's Supper at 8.30pm. The Seder (Passover) meal is a 3000 year old tradition of praying the prayers of the Jewish people along with lamb, bitter herbs and wine. This is the Passover meal that Jesus was celebrating with the disciples on the night of the Last Supper. All are welcome. In the coming weeks we will ask for names so we know how big a sheep to slaughter, now that we've made peace with the shepherds.

Pentecost Sunday

The early Christians dug catacombs around Rome to bury their dead far underground to prevent desecration. Those tunnels also became an important hiding place for the same early Christians. Remember the Gospel story for Pentecost Sunday, "In the evening of the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews." The Parish Pastoral Council have been discussing that Seppelt Winery Great Western have kilometres of underground tunnels, very similar to the catacombs of the early Church. So, we're striking a deal with Seppelt to have Mass on Pentecost Sunday in the catacombs to imagine the life and experience of the early Christians living in fear. At Pentecost they were transformed! We're thinking it will be an extra Mass about lunchtime on June 4 and will include lunch, a tour of the drives and Mass. There will be a cost of about \$30.
