archives:


“In response to an invitation from Fr Kelly, Parish Priest of Charlton, four sisters came from Perth to take charge of the school. They were delighted to find such a flourishing school and to meet the bright happy children who, for many years, had been receiving a Catholic Education from devoted lay teachers.

In 1930 boarders were taken in and secondary classes began in 1940s. Their work progressed and numbers increased so that in 1959 a new school of four classrooms was built and another two were added later.

The Sisters of Our Lady of the Missions withdrew from the parish in 1968 after teaching in its school for 45 years.”

More stories and information of the history of Catholic Education in Charlton will be displayed at our reunion in October.
