Making Connections: The cross is the central symbol of the Christian faith. It reminds us immediately of the death of Jesus through which he won eternal life but it also reminds us of our own struggles and sufferings. 'We all have our own cross to bear'. St Rose of Lima, a young South American saint of the 17th century, said, 'Apart from the cross there is no ladder to heaven'. What do you think she meant by this? Do you know others who are burdened by a cross at the moment? Try to lift a burden from someone this week.

Did you Know?: Points of interest and Catholic lore. The name Peter comes from the Latin word for rock. In last week's gospel, Jesus named Peter the rock on which the Church would be built. Today that rock has become a stumbling block in Jesus' path!

Marriage Tip: Technology and media are useful for connecting and inspiration but they can also rob you of precious couple time. Set family rules for tech, and stick to them.

Daily Prayer: Not by power and popularity, O God, but in suffering and self-sacrifice did Jesus fulfil his call as our Messiah, showing us the cost of discipleship. Do not let us stumble at so daunting a prospect, nor set our minds on the human wisdom that seeks an easier way; but let us deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow with courage where Jesus leads.

A Vocation View: Don't run away from what you are called to be. Christians take the less travelled road. "What does it profit us if we gain the whole world but ruin ourselves in the process?"

Pope Francis Day of Prayer and Penance

In 2016, following a proposal from the Pontifical Commission for the Protection of Minors, the Holy Father established a 'Day of prayer and penance for the victims of sexual abuse and to ask God for a greater awareness of the responsibility of the members of the Church towards the underage people entrusted to them'. Here in Australia, this second-stated purpose is already a focus of **Child Protection Sunday**, which is observed each year on the **second Sunday in September**. Therefore the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference has decided to observe the Day of prayer and penance for the victims of sexual abuse next Sunday.

The Ballarat Clergy Support fund provides for retired priests who have spent a lifetime selflessly caring for others, and who deserve a happy and peaceful retirement. The Fund is currently supporting and caring for eighteen retired priests. Over the next few years a number of priests currently in parish ministry will be moving into retirement, and will also need to be supported by the fund.

Along with the priests' own contribution of approximately \$37,000 per year, this annual collection has allowed the Fund to continue to support our sick and retired clergy.

Eucharist—Session 4 Called and Sent Out

In the last session we reflected on the ways in which Jesus is present when we celebrate Mass. In this session we are reminded that at the end of Mass we are sent out "to love and serve the Lord". As fully initiated Christians we are called into action: we are sent out to follow the example of Jesus.

AIMS:

1. To reflect with the children on how Jesus calls his disciples to a life of love and service.
2. To help the children appreciate that one of the demands of sharing the Eucharist is the call to serve others in love.
3. To enable the children to identify ways in which they can love God and love one another.

We celebrate Social Justice Sunday on 24 September. This year, the Australian Bishops' Social Justice Statement is titled: 'Everyone's Business: Developing an inclusive and sustainable economy'. The Statement calls for an economy that is founded on justice and offers dignity and inclusion to every person. Baptism
