Making Connections: The lamp oil represents those resources we have to meet the challenge of being ready: our actions, our faith, our service to others, our prayer, how much we have loved. It is not that the sensible virgins are being selfish; it is simply that this kind of oil, the way we live our lives, cannot be exchanged. We have to rely on our own resources to be ready.

Did you Know?: Points of interest and Catholic lore. A solemn procession from the house of the bride's father to the house of the bridegroom was an important part of the Jewish wedding ceremony. These bridesmaids are a 'guard of honour' to greet the groom on his return with his bride. Sometimes problems with the marriage contract or the unhurried exchange of gifts between families lead to long delays in their return. Jesus referred to himself as a bridegroom (Mk 2:19-20) and the Church is sometimes referred to as the bride of Christ.

Living the Word: What opportunities for prayer, reflection or retreat are offered within your community to help keep track of life's priorities?

Marriage Tip: When was the last time the two of you laughed so hard you cried? Think of a way to help your honey laugh today – even if it's embarrassing.

Daily Prayer: Lady Wisdom, O God, bids us keep watch, for she is surely found by those who seek her; and your Son warns us to keep awake for the Bridegroom's return. Because we know not the day nor the hour, keep us ready as history's vigil unfolds. Let the light we were given at baptism shine bright, your church resplendent with justice and love.

A Vocation View: We usually put a great amount of preparation into big events like weddings, anniversaries and parties of all kinds. We should prepare ourselves even more for the final banquet in the Kingdom of Heaven!

What is the World Day of the Poor?

* In his apostolic letter to close the Year of Mercy, Pope Francis suggested the Catholic Church set aside one day each year when communities can "reflect on how poverty is at the very heart of the Gospel." He designated this as the "World Day of the Poor." It will be celebrated on the thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary time (two Sundays before the season of Advent each year). **The inaugural World Day of the Poor is Sunday, 19 November 2017.**

* "It would be a day to help communities and each of the baptized to reflect on how **poverty is at the very heart of the Gospel** and that, as long as Lazarus lies at the door of our homes (cf. Lk 16: 19-21), there can be no justice or social peace. This

Day will also represent a genuine form of new evangelization (cf. Mt 11:5) which can renew the face of the Church as She perseveres in her perennial activity of pastoral conversion and witness to mercy."
