Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Making Connections: We may not know people who are literally hungry, thirsty, naked, sick or in prison, although billions of our brothers and sisters fall into these categories. But we all know people who are in need—emotional, financial, spiritual. This week, make a point of doing what Jesus urges in this gospel—tend to someone in need.

Did you Know?: Points of interest and Catholic lore. Service has always been at the heart of the Church's work. Traditionally, the 'corporal works of mercy' are loosely based on Jesus' words in this gospel and include feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and imprisoned and burying the dead. See the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* §2447. The church also identifies 'spiritual works of mercy' (see CCC §2447) as 'instructing, advising, consoling, comforting, forgiving and bearing wrongs patiently.'

Living the Word: Is there a way for you to put your faith into action and join in an activity highlighted in today's gospel; for example. Taking Holy Communion to the elderly, joining the St Vincent De Paul Society?

Sharing the Tradition: This feast marks the completion of the Church's liturgical year. Next Sunday begins Advent and the reading of Mark's Gospel.

Exploring the Word: During his life, Christ was not a king in a political or autocratic sense. Far from it. The subjects of his kingdom are called to service with the marginalised, the poor and the powerless.

Marriage Tip: It is natural to be proud of our children's success and take blame for their failures. Remember that they need your encouragement and support, but allow them to be independent in their life choices.

Daily Prayer: How wonderful a king, Lord God, you have given us in Jesus your Son: neither a monarch throned in splendour nor a warrior bent on revenge, but a shepherd who seeks and rescues the flock, bringing them back, binding them with justice. Prepare us for the Day of Christ's coming in glory by shaping our lives according to his teaching that what we have done for the least of his brothers and sisters we have done for him.

A Vocation View: The Church year ends today. We can proclaim Christ as King because we sense our vocation as being members of Christ's Royal Family, called to serve God and one another.
