

## GOSPEL REFLECTION

We are all familiar with Luke's story of the annunciation, a story that has inspired artists through the ages. God's messenger, Gabriel, approaches a young Galilean Jewish woman, Mary of Nazareth, and greets her as God's graced one. The angel's greeting to Mary is unique. No other person in the Christian scriptures is addressed as "favoured one" or "graced one". The Greek form *kecharitōmenē* contains within it the notion of grace, *charis* in Greek. It can also mean "mercied one".

Mary is troubled by the angel's greeting, succinct as it is. After being addressed as "favoured one", she has been told only that God is with her. She knows the traditions of her people. She knows that those said to be the graced or favoured of God (Noah and Moses and Gideon and Samuel) are called to be agents of God's saving action and to carry heavy responsibilities. Now a young woman is called to be God's agent. In a formula that forms part of angelic announcements of birth, the angel tells Mary not to be afraid and reassures her by stating explicitly that she has been graced by God. The angel then proceeds to announce the conception and birth of the child she is to name "Jesus". This child will reign forever. The prophecy of Nathan, recounted in today's first reading, is to be fulfilled in the conception and birth of Mary's son who is also, and especially, God's son in the line of David who in his turn was first of many "sons of God" called to rule with the justice and the wisdom of God. In the face of almost constant failure on the part of the kings, later prophets projected Israel's hope into the future and looked for one who would truly have the characteristics of God, who would truly be "son of God".

Mary's response to the angel, "How can this be...?" echoes the prayer of David that follows today's first reading: "Who am I...and who are we that you have brought us to this point?" (2 Sam 7:18). Mary learns that God's dwelling place is her own human flesh and that this extraordinary event will be accomplished through the grace of God and the power of God's Holy Spirit. Mary is also to learn that her cousin Elizabeth with conceive a child despite her age "for nothing will be impossible for God." The mysterious workings of God in our world invite the response of Mary: "How can this be...?" As we approach the celebration of the birth of Jesus, we might pause to wonder at the goodness of God at work in the lives of all who incarnate the grace and mercy of God in our world. Let us name them, and give thanks in the spirit of today's gospel.

## CHRISTMAS

### CHRISTMAS JOY AND TINGES OF SADNESS

*They come at evening, scenes from far away, the bitter-sweet of absence and of love, when memory opens her halls of yesterday, and draws her shuttered curtains from above.*  
 Taken from the poem Mission Memories by Columban Fr. John McFadden (1894-1978), these lines capture his bitter-sweet mood as he prepares to celebrate Christmas back home in the U.S. after many years in foreign mission lands. During the long December evenings, memories of Christmas celebrations in those far-away places flood his heart, bringing joy and sadness, tears and smiles.

As Christmas approaches, many people have similar experiences. At unexpected moments, memories of a childhood Christmas gift, or of the first Christmas season as a newlywed couple, or of a surprise guest at the Christmas dinner table stir up in us bittersweet

Elvira, Felisa, Elida, Mabel, Ines, Silvia, Rosann, Margarita, Leonora, Georgina, Norma, Paulina, Noemi, Leticia, Hello, Mary Lou!

These are among a list of people that Fr. McFadden knew and loved in distant places, faces from the past who "pass before my eyes, as twilight dies." Each one of us could compose our own list, which would include some who are still living, as well as others who are deceased. Confronted with grief and loneliness as he recalls those who have died, Fr. McFadden finds comfort in the hope of a joyful reunion.

*But 'God will wipe away all tears' one day, and bid us up with Him, our gracious Lord; Safe in his care, we'll rest, all grief away, our lives, our loves, our family all restored.*

With the consoling realization that the past and the future are safe in God's hands, Fr. McFadden concludes his poem with a prayer for the present Christmas season.

*Lo! The Most High from royal throne descends, to be Our Saviour, sprung from David's line; May His and Mary's joy be yours, my friends, Noel! Noel! O Night, O Night Divine!*

## CHRISTMAS

### A TIME FOR SOLIDARITY WITH REFUGEES & MIGRANTS

In this Christmas season we recall the Holy Family, who shared the same pain of forced displacement and vulnerability encountered by refugee families today. Let us stand in prayerful solidarity with all those families separated across borders.

**“To welcome, to protect, to promote and to integrate”:**  
**Pope Francis calls for solidarity with migrants and refugees**

In his message for the 2018 World Day of Migrants and Refugees, to be commemorated on 14 January 2018, Pope Francis has called for the international community “to respond to the many challenges of contemporary migration with generosity, promptness, wisdom and foresight”.

The Pope reminds us that the Church has a particular concern for migrants and refugee, as “every stranger who knocks at our door is an opportunity for an encounter with Jesus Christ, who identifies with the welcomed and rejected strangers of every age”.

In 2018, the international community will be working towards two ‘global compacts’, for migrants and refugees. The Pope’s message calls for these compacts to be defined by four verbs: “to welcome, to protect, to promote and to integrate”. As such, the Pope advocates for increased opportunities for family reunification, alternative solutions to detention, access to employment and protection from exploitation. On 4 December 2017, the Pope reiterated these themes in his video address to an international meeting preparing the two Global Compacts.
