



He hadn't been raised as a [Christian](#) but he had felt a wonder at the gift of [life](#) and a desire to find out the meaning of that gift. He first discarded the approach of many people who around him, who believed the purpose of [life](#) was only to satisfy desires. He knew he wasn't a beast grazing in a pasture. The philosophers agreed with him. Human beings should rise above desires and live a [life](#) of virtue, they said. But Hilary could see in his own heart that humans were meant for even more than living a [good](#) life.
