Working With Children Checks

Firstly, a thank you to all ministers for their generous and dedicated work in the Parish. We address the criteria requiring a Working With Children Check, which is set out in the publication WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK AND NATIONAL POLICE RECORD CHECK POLICY, "5.6 Any volunteer working in the Diocese, a diocesan agency or in a Parish setting who works with children or who as part of their work as a volunteer are likely to have direct contact with children shall provide a Working with Children Check Card, a copy of which shall be kept at the parish office, diocesan office or diocesan agency as applicable." Therefore, all ministers who are in the Welcome, Sacramental Preparation and Communion to the Sick Ministries will be required to have a current Working With Children Card.
