Privacy: In 2001 the Commonwealth and Victorian governments introduced legislation that deals with the manner in which public and private sector organisations may record, use, store and disclose information. We can only accept requests for names on the bulletin by immediate family members.

Sunday, 11 November is the 100-year anniversary of Armistice Day, which marked the end of World War I.

This particular Remembrance Day will commemorate 100 years since fighting ceased in World War One. 11:00am on Sunday 11 November 2018 is, therefore, a once in a century moment. In that moment we will remember those who had lost their lives in war as we reflect on the armistice (suspension of fighting) that was called exactly 100 years earlier. It was the moment when the guns on the Western Front fell silent after more than four years of continuous warfare. In November 1918 the Germans called for an armistice in order to secure a peace settlement. They accepted allied terms that amounted to unconditional surrender. The 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month attained a special significance in the post-war years. To date, more than 102 000 Australian servicemen and women have lost their lives in combat. It is because of their sacrifice that we can live in a free society today. Red poppies are worn on blazers, shirts, jumpers and other items of clothing on Remembrance Day to remember those who died during a war. Poppies were among the first plants that came from the battlefields of northern France and Belgium during World War I.

They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old; Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will remember them. Lest we forget.
