Known initially as Armistice Day, now as Remembrance Day to acknowledge and pray for all who have died in war, today we especially commemorate the centenary of the signing of the Armistice peace agreement and cessation of hostilities that ended the First World War. After a minute's silence for all who have given their lives serving our nation and others in war, church bells at St Augustine's and throughout Maryborough will be rung just as church bells rang out in towns everywhere to announce the end of the War on 11th November 1918.
