Dear friends, Today's gospel speaks of the second coming of the Son of God, it also known as the end of the world. The scenes of terrible destruction, among them the darkening of the sun and the moon and the disappearance of the stars from heaven, call to mind a great fear. Hence the focus of Jesus is not the disaster that happens but the new life that begins. He points to the fig tree: in winter the tree sheds its leaves and looks dead but when winter is past, it sprouts leaves and soon produces fruits. Here Jesus is preparing his disciples for the dawning of a new era in human history, after the earthly powers have passed away; it will actually be God's era in human history. It is easy to picture God descending from heaven, but what will take place is a coming to God and enthronement in heaven. The signs that will witness point to the beginning of something infinitely greater than what we now have. There will be a gathering of the faithful in front of Jesus, like a faithful gathering in the church for worship. All the people of God who are faithful to the gospel will enter into the glory of God and all will be made whole. The church prepares us to reflect on the second coming of Jesus as we approach the end of the liturgical year by the celebration of the Feast of Christ the King next Sunday. Hence we shall look forward with great joy to the coming of the Son of Man as Christ the King, to take us all into the everlasting Kingdom of joy and happiness. – **Neville.**
