Topics that are passionately and frequently raised include leadership and governance within the Church, the place and role of women, the importance of young people, the living tradition, liturgy and music, the priesthood and other vocations, inclusion and welcome, the sacramental life of the Church, ecology and creation, and social justice.

The stories and reflections that people are taking time to write down are truly inspirational. They reflect people's joys and challenges, their hopes and fears, the deep faith of some and the wavering faith of others.
