**Making Connections:** 'A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people'. Is there an expectancy growing in you as the coming of Christ draws closer? Make a special effort to live ethically this week. There are many opportunities provided by various church agencies at this time of year to share our wealth or good fortune with those who have little.

**Did You Know? Points of Interest and Catholic lore:** Tax collectors at the time of Jesus were disliked immensely for two reasons. They collaborated with the Roman oppressors and they skimmed additional monies from the people for themselves. The Jewish people of this time were hopeful that a Messiah would come to overthrow the tyranny of the Roman Empire and set them free. The word *Messiah* in Hebrew means 'anointed one'; the word *Christ* has exactly the same meaning in Greek.

**Exploring the Word:** 'What must we do?' The Baptist is very clear that to be saved, people need to respond to the ways of God by being in right relationship with their neighbour and by living justly. At Pentecost, this baptism becomes a reality for the early church, forming its members into the new society who respond to God's love by imitating the life and the love of the Son.

**Sharing the Tradition:** The figure of John the Baptist holds a special place in the life of the church as one of the first people to recognise Jesus as the awaited Messiah. Reflect on John's withdrawal into the desert and the tradition of withdrawal that is part of the life of the church. Withdraw or retreat into a quiet place for prayer (Monday's 10am). What are the benefits of such a withdrawal?

**Symbols and Images:** The image of Jesus as a farmer who separates the wheat from the chaff is a stern one, but it serves as a reminder that the choices we make have consequences, not only in this life but in the eternal life to come. Truly living the life of a Christian is not an easy task.

**Daily Prayer:** Lord our God, already in our midst and yet to come, your presence delights us even now as we long for your peace. Winnow from our lives the chaff of selfishness and sin. Sow in us a harvest of gentleness and generosity, for we rejoice in you, even as you exult and sing for joy over us.

**Marriage Tip:** "Although they go forth weeping... They shall come back rejoicing." (Ps 126:6) Every marriage faces times of sorrow and weeping. Trust in the Lord's care for you as you await the promised time of rejoicing.

**Vocational View:** Have you ever asked: "What ought I do?" Simply, tell the Good News to people. Nothing else matters.

Longing, that's what the Advent season is. It is a season of holy expectation culminating in joyous gratitude for the birth of Jesus Christ, our Saviour. Realisation of God's immense care for you, expressed through the gift of His Son, will make your love increase this Advent season for your family, friends and all whom you encounter.

**May God bless you with a Holy Advent.**

- ◇ Am I "the reed of God" that is hollow within, so as to receive the breath of God and to make music for God in my life?
- ◇ Am I an empty nest with space to welcome Jesus home, to dwell within my heart and welcome others into Christ's presence?
