Sharing the Tradition: 'The mission of Christ and the Holy Spirit is brought to completion in the Church' (CCC§737). At the heart of the church's action in the world is the program adopted by Jesus in the synagogue at Nazareth. The continuation of the mission to bring hope to the hopeless and inclusion to the outcast motivates many agencies of the church, both locally and globally. All Christians have a role to play in this task: 'By living with the mind of Christ, Christians hasten the coming of the reign of God, a kingdom of justice, love and peace' (CCC§2046).

Symbols and Images: This episode marks the first of many rejections experienced by Jesus. The final rejection was, of course, to lead to the cross, but the cross is not the end of the story, nor is this rejection in Nazareth. Jesus simply slips away and continues on the path he has chosen.

Daily Prayer: God of the prophets, your love reaches far beyond the boundaries of covenant and command. Redeemed by a love so patient and kind, may we offer that same love to others and so proclaim you to the world by the witness of our lives.

Marriage Tip: Courtesy goes a long way in marriage. Pope Francis calls "May I?" one of the three "magic words" of family life. Being polite and kind to your family members is always a good idea.

Vocational View: The Lord says: "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you; before you were born I dedicated you." Always listen to an Old Friend.

Dear Colleagues,

I write to you from Ballarat this morning where I attended the Central Zone Mass to mark the beginning of the Catholic education year. Across our diocese, there are similar celebrations drawing us together as a Catholic education community and nourishing us for the journey ahead. Our theme today was "Listen with the Ear of Your Heart" and Bishop Paul invited us to consider how the sort of deep listening proposed by Aboriginal Elder Miriam-Rose Ungunmerr might enable us to connect with God through nature and through creation and to come to know ourselves and our call more fully. Last week, the staff of the Catholic Education Office gathered to focus our energy and attention for the 2019 school year. We also took the time to engage in some "deep listening" through a Listening and Dialogue Encounter in the preparation for the Plenary council, seeking to discern our answers to the question, "What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?"

The late Daniel O'Leary reminds us that in order to discern the way forward when courage and compassion are needed, we must first do our own "inner work":

Authentic hearts are needed to persevere on the journey we are beginning. There is the utter necessity of doing our own 'inner work' so that courageous and compassionate conversations will happen. They will not happen if we hold any resentment towards others, or if, in the pursuit of the particular passion of our own hearts, we fail to listen to our fellow travellers. Without a profound awareness of our emotions and how we share them... the road will be too long and difficult for us, too many obstacles around and within us, and our great little hearts will just give up.

It seems to me that these days before students begin provide just a little space for that "inner work" and the 'deep listening' which might prepare our authentic hearts for the journey we share together in catholic education and in our Church community this year.

We pray as we enter into this school year that the times of "deep listening" and our attention to "inner work" may help us to make space to listen to God's call to each of us and to our diocesan education community. May we be fully present with those who accompany us on this journey and may we continue *as partners in Catholic Education and open to God's presence in pursuing fullness of life for all.*

Pope's First 2019 address: Prayer involves recognising self as God's beloved Child

Christians are not better than other people, Pope Francis said, but they do know that God is their Father and they are called "to reflect a ray of his goodness in this world thirsting for goodness, waiting for good news".

Proclaiming the beatitudes, the Pope said, Jesus affirms the blessedness and happiness of "a series of categories of people, who—in his time, but also in ours—are not particularly esteemed. Blessed are the poor, the meek, the merciful, the humble of heart. This is the revolution of the Gospel! Where the Gospel is, there is revolution because the Gospel does not leave things as they were".

The core of the Sermon on the Mount, he continued, is: "You are sons and daughters of your father who is in heaven", which is why Jesus then teaches the crowd to pray the Our Father.

A Christian knows how to stand before God with awe, to call upon him as Father and try to reflect his goodness in the world.

"If you go to Church, live like a child [of God] and like a brother or sister" to others, Pope Francis said.

"He asks only that we keep open a channel of communication with him to discover continually that we are his beloved children."
