**Making Connections:** Spend time each day reflecting on being 'caught up' in the net of Christ and what that means for you. Repeat these words of the prophet Isaiah from the first reading: 'Whom shall I send? Who will be my messenger?' 'Here I am, Lord. Send me!'

**Did You Know? Points of interest and Catholic lore:** The huge haul of fish is symbolic of the overabundance of good that is promised to those who believe in and follow Jesus. It is also a symbol of the abundance of the messianic banquet that Jesus brings.

**Exploring the Word:** The large crowd pressed on Jesus and he made use of the 'pulpit' of the boat. When asked to 'put into the deep', Simon, despite his misgivings, complies. The sheer wonder of the unprecedented catch of fish hints that somehow that action of God is to be traced in this extraordinary event. Simon—now with his Christian name, Peter, addressed Jesus as 'Lord'. Peter, James and John leave everything and follow him.

**Sharing the Tradition:** Just as Peter became a 'fisher of men' and women, the church has continued to spread the gospel and draw people into the net of Christ. The norm in the early church was adult baptism, but over the centuries, the sacrament became centred on infants.

**Symbols and Images:** One symbolic image of the church is a boat, and another is a net. St Cyril, a bishop of Jerusalem in the fourth century, once said to his catechumens: 'You now find yourselves within the fishing nets of Christ. Let yourselves be caught because he wants to capture you, not kill you, but give you life.' Does this image speak to you?

**Daily Prayer:** Lord God, all-holy One, you came among us in Jesus, who sat teaching among the fishermen. He would not depart from us sinners but invited us to follow him and become his disciples, his friends. Place on our lips this good news of salvation, and in our hearts a welcome from which no one is excluded, a love that delights in befriending all.

**Marriage Tip:** Have you gone on a date with your spouse recently? It doesn't have to be fancy or super-creative, but scheduling dates affirms your desire to keep your relationship strong.

**Vocational View:** God does not ask you to be successful: God asks you to be faithful. Put your vocation ahead of your career.

**Future Governance of Emmanuel College**

At the beginning of 2018 it was announced that the Christian Brothers intended to withdraw from sponsorship of Emmanuel College. Since the decision of the Christian Brothers to withdraw, the College Governors have worked with the Board of Management to discern the most appropriate form of Governance for the future. St Joseph's Parish and the Institute of Sisters of Mercy of Australia & Papua New Guinea will continue, in the interim, to be the joint sponsors of Emmanuel College. A Memorandum of Understanding has been prepared and will guide the transition of the College's governance to Mercy Education Limited. The transition process is underway and whilst the final date of transfer has not been determined, it will be no later than 1st January 2021.

**11 February—World Day of the Sick**

World Day of the Sick is an observation that was started by Pope John Paul II as a way for believers to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses. The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes. People around the world take the time to pray for the sick and for those who work very hard to alleviate the sufferings of the sick on this day. Faith organisations mark this day especially to provide the sick with medicines, food and spiritual guidance. Pope John Paul II initiated the day in 1992 to encourage people to pray for those who suffer from illness and for their caregivers.
