

Did You Know?: The Sea of Galilee is also known as the Sea of Tiberias. Jesus' triple repetition of his question to Peter, 'Do you love me?' echoes the three denials of Jesus by Peter on the morning of his execution. The Greek word for fish, *ichthys*, is an acronym of the Greek words for 'Jesus Christ, Son of God, Saviour'. The fish was an early symbol used by Christians to denote Christ. Early tradition holds that Peter met his death by being crucified upside down in Rome.



Exploring the Word: The great haul of fish of so many varieties indicates that the Good News of the Gospel will take root in many nations and bring many converts, but only with the help of the Lord. Alone, they had been unsuccessful! The open-air meal indicates that Jesus still nourishes his disciples and evokes the many meals that Jesus shared with his followers. The Eucharist continues to nourish those who follow the risen Lord. Jesus' dialogue with Peter establishes that love is the basis from which genuine Christian ministry of service springs. Along with other gospel texts, this passage reinforces the role given to Peter as the future leader of the flock, the one who is entrusted with the task of caring for the sheep after Shepherd has gone.

Sharing the Tradition: The period between Easter and Pentecost is a time of *mystagogy*—a time for pondering and coming to a deeper understanding of the experiences of initiation, and a time for catechesis on the sacraments. The sacramental overtones contained in today's texts are, the Eucharistic meal, and Peter's diving into the waters to come to Christ. The role of Peter as the leader of the community of believers has been handed down in succession to the popes. The papacy and the structure of church leadership, might be viewed as a ministry of service based on love.

Symbols and Images: The image of the boat is an ancient image for the church. The enormous catch of fish symbolises the success that the disciples will have in becoming 'fishers of men' and leading people to belief in the risen Christ. The reason for the precise number of 153 remains a mystery.

Daily Prayer: With a canticle of praise, O God enthroned in glory, we join every creature in worshipping Jesus who is alive among us and who invites us to this meal. Open our eyes to recognise your risen Son as he continues to show himself to his disciples through the worship and witness of the church. Loosen our tongues by the gift of your Holy Spirit that we may proclaim before all the world that Jesus is Lord.

Marriage Tip: What helps you calm down when you are upset? Are there trigger words that cause situations to escalate? Identify these and work with your spouse to adjust your conversations accordingly.

Vocational View: Let people know that Jesus has the solution. Cast your net on the other side of life. Listen to God's Son. And tell the world what you hear!


