## GOSPEL REFLECTION

from *In Conversation with God*

Bethany lies about two miles from Jerusalem. Jesus would often stop there on his way to the holy city. He felt at home in that place, surrounded by joy and affection. This is how we ought to welcome Jesus, who is in the Tabernacle. He, more than anyone, deserves our loving attention.

In this warm family environment Martha and Mary behaved with naturalness and simplicity, even as they revealed different attitudes. Martha rightly wanted to welcome the Lord in a fitting manner. But she lost her equanimity and became frustrated. Mary, on the other hand, sat at the Lord's feet and listened to his teaching. She forgets about her sister and does nothing else but listen to his word. With the help of divine grace, we have to live a *unity of life*, which unites Martha's and Mary's attitudes.

For centuries these sisters have been held to represent two rival lifestyles. According to this traditional interpretation Mary exemplifies the way of contemplation, the life of union with God. Similarly, Martha is seen as the personification of an active life of work. But the contemplative life is not simply sitting at the feet of Jesus, doing nothing. That would be pure indolence, for we must find God in our daily tasks, transforming our work into the hinge

on which our calling to sanctity rests and turns. It's difficult, maybe even impossible, to have a deep interior life and at the same time live a vibrant apostolate if we lack a commitment to daily work. It is there in the midst of work — through it, not despite it — that God calls most of us to holiness. Sanctification of work was the constant message of St Josemaría Escrivá (1902–1975). Speaking to a large gathering, he put it this way:

*“God waits for us every day, in laboratories, in lecture theatres, in offices, in factories, on farms, in workshops, in the home and in all the immense panorama of work.*



*Understand this well: there is something holy, something divine hidden in the most ordinary situations, and it is up to each one of you to discover it. There is no other way. Either we learn to find our Lord in ordinary, everyday life, or else we shall never find him. That is why I can tell you that our age needs to give back to matter, and to the most trivial occurrences and situations, their noble and original meaning. It needs to restore them to the service of the Kingdom of God, to spiritualize them, turning them into a means and an occasion for a continuous meeting with Jesus Christ.”*

This contemporary vision of the Christian vocation combines Mary's love with the 'work ethic' of Martha.
