GOSPEL OF JOHN BIBLE STUDY GROUP: The next meetings of our Parish Bible Study Group are this week on Tuesday Nov. 12th at 7.00pm and Friday Nov. 15th at 1.00pm. These will be our final meetings until February 2020. All welcome.

PLENARY COUNCIL 2020: In our endeavor to make us a Prayerful and Eucharistic Christ-centered Church, there have been more than 222,000 people taking part in listening and dialogue encounters and 17,457 submissions to the first stage of the Australian Plenary Council. A question “Where are we now?” has been asked by Archbishop Tim Costelloe SDB, “What is God inviting us to do to enable our transformation – with the grace of the Holy Spirit – into a community of disciples who are journeying together into a deeper intimacy with God.” From this, have come six National Themes for Discernment that have been inspired by the data and call towards the future. These Themes are:-

(1) Missionary and Evangelising – We are asked to be Missionary Disciples to do God’s mission as we walk in the footsteps of Jesus.

(2) Inclusive, Participatory and Synodal – How is God calling us to be a Christ-centered Church.

(3) Prayerful and Eucharistic – We are invited to reflect on Scripture, Church teaching.

(4) Humble, Healing and Merciful – God is asking us to do something about clericalism and subsequent abuse arising from this misuse of power. God is asking us to remember and come to know Jesus and to live as He did.

(5) A Joyful Hope-Filled and Servant Community – To strengthen our practice as Christians through public worship and genuine assistance to the people seeking a loving relationship with Jesus. We need to reach people who are not inclined to attend established public worship.

(6) Open to Conversion, Renewal and Reform – To adopt a change of heart. Adopt a team approach and inclusivity within the Church. Adopt the Gospel values. All Baptised have a role in the life and mission of the Church.

This process is of Communal discernment, rather than Individual discernment and as such we are called to work together as a community. Early in January, there will be a series of meetings held immediately after Sunday Masses and these Themes and a Scripture reading appropriate to the Theme, will be read and prayed about. Please join in and discuss your thoughts about the Scripture reading and how it relates to the Theme we will discuss and what we can do as a Community towards becoming a Christ-centered Church.

PLENARY COUNCIL PRAYER: Blessed are you, God of all creation. You have given us life and light and all the wonders of the world. You have sent your Son Jesus to be our Saviour and your Holy Spirit to be our guide. As we prepare for the plenary council, we ask you to come into our hearts with your Son and Holy Spirit. May your wisdom show us the way, for your word is a lamp for our feet and a light for our path. Come and fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in us the fire of your love, that we may live by your gospel and share your good news with all we meet.
